YARDS Graduates 8th Class!

On Saturday November 10, 2012, friends, family and community leaders gathered to celebrate the 8th YARDS class graduation following 9 weeks of training in desert landscape, health and safety on the job, and personal development skills. TCB President Michael Jette, from the Attorney General's Office, and Judge Susan Kettlewell, presented graduates with certificates and acknowledged their success. Joan Lionetti, TCB Executive Director and founder of the YARDS program, recognized the many instructors, sponsors and supporters of the program, with Dave Stadle, Coordinator, Pima County Juvenile Court/Community Service Unit and co-director of the YARDS program. Dave was also recognized for his 30 years of service to Pima County Juvenile Court. Special recognition to: Bartlett Tree Service and Mary Ann Elwood, instructor and volunteer, and Sofia Angkasa, Assistant Coordinator.



To date 58 youth on probation have completed the program. Classes are taught by professionals from University of Arizona, landscape industry, health and safety and employment development backgrounds. The campus is provided by the Pima County Extension, Tucson Botanical Gardens, UofA Ag Center and Cano Nursery. The program has been grant funded by the Wolslager Foundation, with donations from Pima County Juvenile Court and private donations. This year YARDS received the prestigious Gold Leaf Award from the International Society of Arboriculture at the Western Chapter meeting at Asilomar, California.

Now Open: Children's Memorial at Michael Perry Park & Commemorative Tree Park at Pantano Wash



Tucson's second Children's Memorial is now open at Michael Perry Park, on Pantano Parkway just south of Golf Links Rd. The first name engravings took place at this site in October. Parents or guardians of deceased children may request names to be added at this new site or at the original Children's Memorial Park on for \$4 per letter of the name.

Invasive Buffelgrass continues to threaten to our unique Sonoran Desert ecology, and human safety due to increased fire risk in the urban environment! Upcoming work days to help reduce this threat:

- ◆ 12/1/2012: West University area. Meet at Historic Y (300 E. University Blvd.) at 8:30am and work the side street and alleys until about 11am.
- ◆ 12/8/2012: Silverbell and El Camino del Cerro. Meet at entrance of Columbus Park and work along the roadside from 8:30-11am.
- ◆ 12/15/2012: Houghton and Old Spanish Trail. Meet in the church parking lot at 8:30 am and work along the bike path and roadside until about 11am.
- ◆ 1/5/2013: A Mountain buffelgrass removal workshop. From 1-10, go West on Congress Street to just before it intersects with Silverbell, turn south (left) on Cuesta and continue to top parking lot.
- ◆ 1/12/2013: - 8:30—11:00 a.m.: La Cholla Blvd. just north of Ajo Way. Meet at the Fiesta area parking lot on the west side of La Cholla.

Team Up to Clean Up our Neighborhoods!

The City of Tucson Neighborhood Clean-up Program recently expanded to include incorporated homeowners' associations and small, organized groups of neighbors. This program was originally set up for registered neighborhoods, providing a limited number of roll-off dumpsters without hauling and disposal charges, to assist residents who work together to clean-up their neighborhood, made possible by Environmental Services residential customer fees. The program is coordinated by the City's Environmental Services (ES) & Housing and Community Development (HCD) departments.
